

2017 CHORI Summer Student Research Program

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS INTERESTED IN CLINICAL RESEARCH



The objective of the CHORI/DDCF Student Clinical Research Program is to provide short-term training opportunities for High School students interested in clinical research. The goal is to provide these opportunities for individuals from disadvantaged backgrounds, racial and ethnic minorities, and others who are underrepresented in this field (e.g. individuals with disabilities). The Program provides the students with a research training experience to stimulate interest in pursuing a career in biomedical, clinical and/or behavioral research in a friendly and nurturing environment.

To qualify, the student should:

Fulfill the eligibility requirements (as defined on the CHORI Website)

- Be in good standing with an interest in science and provide evidence of academic excellence
- Be in their junior or senior years of High School, with at least one year in math and biology
- Be a citizen, non-citizen national, or permanent resident of the United States (individuals on temporary or student visas are not eligible)



6 funded positions will be available

The awardees will:

Be paired with a mentor who will guide them through a research project
Begin the project part time after school (April-June) continue to work full time during the summer (June 12– Aug 11, 2016)



- Must attend an orientation session
- Participate in a research program based on a structured curriculum
- Attend weekly seminars and meetings
- Present their research findings at a one-day Research Symposium

Funding: The Doris Duke Charitable Foundation has provided funding for the CHORI Summer Student Research to support High School Students Short Term Training to increase diversity in health-related research. Students who meet the criteria for the Doris Duke proposal will be eligible to receive a stipend.
